Chief's proposal is to add some resources in order to make this happen such as filling a FT position that has been vacant specifically for this. Nolan requested a breakdown of the cost of putting in the cameras as well as what revenue the City would expect to collect from the cameras. Chief also noted that this will be a Council Program not a PD program. Chief also shared that the Police Department participated in a training exercise with the COHO and the Coast Guard base out on the water, Chief would like to invite Corporal Dombrowski to a meeting to discuss what the exercise entailed. The Police Department is working on ways make the COHO safer.

**Port Angeles Fire Department Report:** Chief Sanders began by touching base on the Community Paramedic program as well as Fire Department hiring. The Fire Department is going down a path of hiring EMTs and putting them through Paramedic School. The Department will be testing in May, hoping for 18 candidates to interview to select 3-4 candidates from that group. Chief also noted that Chief Bagues did a tremendous amount of work on a training Burn that was a great success, the entire Fire Department as well as volunteers and CCFD2 were able to participate and train on the structure. Chief gave an update of upcoming Fire Department Events:

- May 6-10<sup>th</sup> Sparky week, been running since 1964
- April 27th, partnering w Red Cross to install Smoke Detectors to high risk communities
- May 18th, Bike Safety Fair at Lincoln BMX Park
- Pancake Breakfast (date to come)

**GOOD OF THE ORDER:**

Evan – Encouraged the Board to watch the KOMO video “Seattle is Dying”

Kiara – Noted that students are concerned about all of the cutback rumors going around.

Lourene – Inquired about the design revisions to Boulevard, conversation ensued. She also noted that Mark had not been in attendance yet this year and asked Allan to reach out to him.

Nolan – Noted that FEMA is now involved in helping with the loss that the City/County incurred during the December storm.

Dr. Zoble – Stated that he is hoping that the Code Enforcement position is funded because he feels strongly that it is needed.
